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STARTING ITS SECOND DECADE, ROC THE FUTURE ALLIANCE CELEBRATES 11 YEARS OF IMPROVING OUTCOMES FOR ROCHESTER'S CHILDREN

Annual Event Highlights 'State of Our Children' Report Card and Collaborative Actions

ROCHESTER, NY – On Friday, January 19, <u>**ROC the Future Alliance**</u> (RTFA) hosts its 11th annual ticketed luncheon celebration as Rochester's collective educational impact initiative, and releases its annual **State of Our Children Report Card.** The event takes place from 11:30 am-1:30 pm at ARTISANworks (565 Blossom Rd., Rochester). RTFA brings together a coalition of more than 60 systems partners and parents working toward a shared vision of academic success for every child regardless of their situation.

In choosing this year's theme –'Seeding Youth Success' – ROC the Future Executive Director Brian Lewis notes that "when we make investments in our youth and ensure that they have supportive environments, they can learn and grow."

"This event also provides us an opportunity to acknowledge the powerful collective efforts happening across our alliance and in our community" says Lewis, "to ensure every child in Rochester is school ready, supported and successful from cradle to career."

This year's annual 'State of Our Children' Report Card presentation continues RTFA's data-driven measurement of success, a public accountability to the greater community by measuring and reporting key indicators. Research and information gleaned from the community help better understand and identify the root causes of challenges.

Focusing on the following four areas, the report card shares multiple outcomes, including:

- **Early Childhood:** After launching in 2022 and completing a one-year planning phase, the Whole Child Initiative (WCI) transitioned to implementation mode in March of 2023 with two key community engagement activities: Parent Cafés and System Support Mapping.
- High School Outcomes: Inspired by the Be Strong Families Parent Café model—which RTFA's Whole Child Initiative rolled out in 2023–East EPO's (Educational Partnership Organization) Community Cafés now serve as a sanctuary for fostering genuine connections among scholars, families, staff, and community partners.
- **Parent/Family Partnerships:** In 2023, RTFA established Parent/Family Partner Cornerstones to fortify its commitment to sharing power with parents.
- **Youth Leadership and Engagement:** Last April, the "Youth United: Building a Better Rochester" collaboration brought more than 140 youth and chaperones together for a day-long summit aimed at teaching teens how to take direct action to improve their community.

Event Keynote Speaker Dr. April Aycock, Director of Monroe County Office of Mental Health, will discuss mental health as it relates to seeding youth success. "When children have a collective positive community support system," she says, "hopes and dreams for a better future do not have to be deferred."
