
RMAPI Advocacy Day

ROC the Future Alliance backbone team members and Parent/Family Partners joined RMAPI in Albany to meet with lawmakers and advocate for RMAPI's priorities in their 2024 Policy Agenda.

The coalition met with 16 statewide leaders, calling for actions that directly address the root causes of poverty -- housing, childcare, raising income, mental health, and criminalization and exploitation.

Through the statewide connections made, RMAPI hopes to better raise up our community's voice and push for legislation that enables upward mobility for individuals and families.

RCSD Budget Adopted

Ahead of Rochester City School District's budget passing, this review of the 2024-2025 draft budget by The Children's Agenda highlights some of the pressing needs facing students at RCSD and offers solutions for adoption. The Children's Agenda reviewed the RCSD budget as an independent advocacy organization focusing on what works best for kids based on current research. Their areas of focus were developed over years of collaboration with caregivers, students, and community partners.

ROC the Future Alliance makes Strides in High School Graduation

The High School Graduation Outcome Team has been on an exciting journey of engagement and exploration to identify community and data driven strategies to positively impact attendance, the 9th grade experience, and high school graduation. When we say, "high school graduation," we mean college and career ready. Our latest endeavor was on Tuesday, April 9th, where 4 RTFA Parent/Family Partners, both High School Graduation Outcome Team Co-Chairs, and 4 backbone staff came together for a 3-hour extended planning session to draft a 2024 HSGOT roadmap. In addition, we were also able to fellowship and build community.



Barriers to Black student enrollment and retention in post-secondary programs

It is no secret that many Black students in the United States encounter unique obstacles when completing post-secondary programs. However, we must make data informed decisions to address this problem.

In the fall of 2022, Gallup conducted a study interviewing 6,008 students currently enrolled in different program types, including 1,106 non-Hispanic Black students. Out of the non-Hispanic Black students included in the study, 155 were pursuing professional certifications, 287 were enrolled in certificate programs, 347 were in associate degree programs, and 317 were pursuing bachelor's degrees.
